## Photoraphs by Alana Proosa

Jaanus Samma (b. 1982, Estonia) is a visual artist based in Tallinn, Estonia. His body of work includes photos, installations and videos with topics grounded in gender and queer studies. His current fields of interest include history, ethnography and museology as well as

narratives used at the intersection of the three. In his most recent projects, he has explored the museum as a tool for establishing authentic histories and asserting cultural canons. In queering national heritage, he has found ways of broadening the perspectives on identity formation and offered alternative ways of contextualizing the past.

In 2023 he had a solo exhibition 'Iron Men' at the Contemporary Art Museum of Estonia (EKKM). In 2022 he curated an extensive exhibition 'Still Lifes on National Motifs' in Estonian Museum of Applied Art and Design, where he examined the use of national patterns and motifs in Estonian applied art and prints from the 1930s to the 1950s together with his own new works. In 2018 Eugenio Viola curated his exhibition 'Outhouse by the Church' in Nomas Foundation, Rome. His works have been featured in group exhibitions including 'As Though We Hid the Sun in a Sea of Stories – Fragments for a Geopoetics of North Eurasia' in Haus der Kulturen der Welt (HKW), Berlin, 35th Ljubljana Biennale 2023, Momentum 12, Oslo 2023, "and suddenly it all blossoms", The 2nd Riga International Biennial of Contemporary Art curated by Rebecca Lamarche-Vadel "There and Back Again. Contemporary art from the Baltic Sea region", Kiasma, Helsinki (2018-2019). In 2015, Samma represented Estonia at the 56th Venice Biennial.
